

From Our Associate Pastor:

This July will bring a transition to our parish as Monsignor Ken Morman comes to serve here at St. Paul and I will leave to serve as an associate pastor to the Sandusky parishes. Our St. Paul parish family will be greatly blessed by Monsignor Morman's ministry and presence. I have always experienced him as very warm, energetic, gracious, and kind. He will be greatly missed at Mount St. Mary's Seminary of the West in Cincinnati. The rector of the seminary, Benedict D. O'Cinnsealaigh, said the following in his farewell address for Monsignor Morman to faculty, staff, and students there: "Monsignor Ken Morman is without doubt one of a kind. An outstanding teacher, a mentor to faculty, seminarians and students, a true and faithful servant of God, and a tremendous witness to us all of what it means to be a kind priest and a gentle shepherd." I am sure you will all offer him a very warm welcome come July.

As I head to Sandusky there is not only a transition for priests serving the parishes but a transition and change in the way the Sandusky parishes operate. Until this July the three parishes of Holy Angels, St. Mary, and Sts. Peter and Paul, have been accustomed to each having their own pastors, while St. Mary has also had an associate. Yet beginning in July there will be a team of three priests: Fr. Joe Steinbauer, originally from Clyde St. Mary, will be pastor of all three parishes, with Fr. Jason Kahle and myself assigned as associate pastors to all three parishes. There will also be one pastoral staff to serve the three parishes. This will most certainly be a challenging transition for the people of all three parishes. The parishes have already begun working with each other in various ways, such as RCIA, youth ministry, and through their support of Sandusky Central Catholic Schools, but the new configuration invites them to think of themselves as one Sandusky Catholic Community. We three priests will live in the rectory at St. Mary and the offices for the whole pastoral staff will be located at Sts. Peter and Paul.

This new configuration is one of many occurring in the Toledo diocese beginning last year and continuing through 2013. These new configurations are rooted in a pastoral plan begun by Bishop Hoffman, the *Faith and Futures Consultation*, which aimed to look at the best way to serve the people of our diocese considering changing demographics and a decrease in the number of active priests serving our diocese. In 2005 initial changes were made as Bishop Blair began acting on the plan.

The new configuration in Sandusky is a result of all the deaneries of our diocese being asked in 2010 to review and study what was recommended in 2005 and provide feedback to the diocese related to their current


situations. The new plans were a result of both local and diocesan input and planning. Each deanery was asked to prepare a plan with one less priest available to serve the parishes of the deanery. Our Saint John Neumann deanery did not recommend a plan to serve our parishes with one less priest due to changes that have occurred in recent years. At least for the time being our deanery (Wakeman St. Mary, New London Our Lady of Lourdes, Monroeville St. Joseph, Peru St. Alphonsus, Milan St. Anthony, Norwalk St. Mary, Bellevue Immaculate Conception, and St. Paul) will still be served by six priests with a pastoral leader at St. Mary in Wakeman (Sr. Carroll Schemenauer, SND).

We need to remember that our Church has had a long history (of course nearly 2000 years) and the ways we have served one another and the world have changed at times as well. All members of the Body of Christ are called to serve the Church and bring Christ to the world, whenever and wherever we find ourselves in the unique circumstances of each of our lives. The Holy Spirit is with us to guide us if we are only attentive to and open to His promptings. Concerning vocations to the priesthood there is hope as over the last several years there has been an increase in enrollment in seminaries throughout the country, including an increased number of seminarians for our own diocese. We can be thankful that John McLaughlin, a son of our parish, is in formation and discernment at St. Meinrad. Please pray for him, Deacon Scott Carroll (who will be joining us again soon), and all men discerning the priesthood, as well as all women and men discerning the religious or consecrated life.

We need to pray as well for holy marriages. Strong and holy vocations do not drop from the sky; they come from strong and holy families, families that model generosity and openness to God's plan for their lives. Have you ever asked or encouraged someone you knew to think about priesthood or religious life? I first considered priesthood only because I was asked. God wants to speak through us. Have you realized that marriage itself is a vocation or calling to holiness? Have you encouraged others to see marriage this way? Do we remember that as baptized members of the Church we are all called to holiness and are invited to consider how God is calling us to serve the Church and world? What is God calling each of us to do and how is He calling us to encourage others to serve?

Let us pray for one another as we seek to listen to God's call in our lives each and every day.

Sharing - **From Fr. Bob Haas:** Once again the St. Joseph Mission fund is grateful to the generosity of the good people of St. Paul's church for their generous donation of \$1,160.00 for missions in Belize. It will be split between a lunch program for poor children going to school and Sacred Heart Parish in San Ignacio, Cayo District, that runs 13 primary schools, two high schools, a junior college, and a domestic violence shelter, as well as cares for 17 chapels. We have been supporting them this current and past year with 8 chalices, 8 ciboria, one monstrance, and 7 new Roman missals. For that whole complex they had only 3 chalices and 3 ciboria. They had three priests in the past, got down to one, and now are up to four, three being members of a new missionary order out of Guatemala. Fr. Leo Palma is the pastor and is always very grateful for your support. I usually let him know that funds come from St. Paul's and in his emails to me he says to thank you!

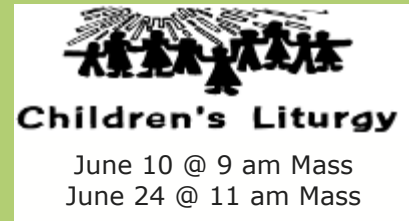

As shown above, our weekly offerings are \$58,000 below budget which is creating a financial crunch at year end. On May 1, our cash balances were \$280,000, our anticipated cash income for May and June is \$190,000 and anticipated expenses are \$455,000. These projections will use up all our available cash and will leave just \$15,000 to begin the new year. Included in our expenses to be paid by June 30 are \$260,000 to Norwalk Catholic Schools and \$95,000 to the Diocese. Please do what you can to decrease the budget short fall between now and June 30.
